





## Fisheries & Oceans Canada (DFO)- Conservation & Protection (C&P) Directorate

- The C&P Directorate enforces laws aimed to conserve Canada's aquatic resources and protect endangered species, fish habitat, and oceans.
- Fisheries & Oceans Canada employs over 500
   Fishery Officers within the departments regulatory law enforcement branch – Conservation & Protection (C&P).
- Fishery Officers are tasked with the enforcement of Canada's Federal legislation to protect fisheries resources, fish habitat, endangered aquatic species and ocean ecosystems. Their compliance and enforcement activities are conducted on land, air, and sea.











- Leverage CCG fleet of mid-shore and offshore patrol vessels
- Supported by dedicated fisheries intelligence
- Multiple fisheries surveillance aircraft
- Armed and highly trained regulatory enforcement agency
- Supported by forensics capabilities

## C&P's International Fisheries Enforcement Program

- C&P's International Enforcement Program delivers Canada's efforts abroad to combat Illegal, Unregulated, and Unreported fishing (IUU-F) and protect marine biodiversity, including:
  - Coordination of international operations.
  - Dark Vessel Detection (DVD) satellite surveillance support to international partners.
  - Support to Canada's **engagement at RFMOs** and **international fora**.
  - Links to other Dept activities under IUU Action Alliance, High Level Panel for Oceans, Interpol, etc.










### C&P's Dark Vessel Detection Program

- Provides **layered multi-sensor** satellite data to support counter IUU-F operations.
- Relies on both commercial and government owned satellite assets to provide near-real time surveillance.
- Utilizes powerful machine learning algorithms to automatically fuse and correlate detections with vessels that are broadcasting their locations (AIS/VMS) and highlights non-broadcasting vessels (dark vessels).
- Incorporates historical vessel information, environmental data, and analytics to support and facilitate analysis.










## DVD – Regional Support

- DVD supports Ecuador and Peru monitor the distant water foreign fleets, such as the 400+ squid fleet.
- DVD provides the South Pacific Islands Forum Fisheries Agency (FFA) with remote sensing surveillance support during surge operations conducted by multilateral partners.
- Contributes to IUU fishing surveillance in the North Pacific, Bahamas, Costa Rica.
- Serves to monitor marine protected areas, such as the Galapagos Marine Reserve.
- DFO will be deploying the system in the Indo Pacific, as part of Canada's Indo Pacific strategy.











# NORTH PACIFIC MANAGERS ADOPT MUCH-NEEDED FISHERIES REFORMS, SHARK CONSERVATION EFFORT

North Pacific managers adopt much-needed fisheries reforms, shark conservation effort. The annual meeting of the North Pacific Fisheries Commission (NPFC) ended with an important agreement to reform transshipment monitoring and regulations. Transshipment, the transfer of catch from a fishing vessel to a carrier vessel, is a critical part of the seafood supply chain, but loopholes abound, making it easier for illegal activities to take place in the process. By agreeing to close gaps in management, improve vessel authorisation processes, report transshipment of bycatch species, require reporting of









## DFO's Emerging Engagement within the Indo-Pacific

- Canada recently announced funding for increased IUU-F engagement within the Indo-Pacific region.
- Increase engagement at RFMOs.
- Funding for 5 years to broaden delivery of DVD platform within region, and:
- Support partner fisheries/maritime enforcement agencies with capacity building.
- Fund NGOs/organizations to pursue other initiatives to improve marine biodiversity through measures to tackle IUU-F and strengthen enforcement capacity.
- Increase collaboration with ASEAN countries, including through Canada's role as ASEAN "Strategic Partner", and within ASEAN Network for Combatting IUU Fishing (AN-IUU).
